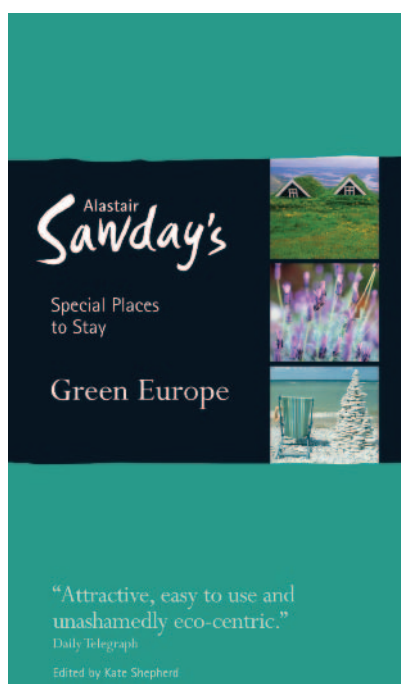




# Green Europe

## Engholm Husky Lodge

Arrive to the call of 50 working huskies, their ghostly howls from the compound rushing through the pines to the porch of your turf-sprouting hut. Naturally snug and seated around suspended stone tables beneath moose-antler lights, guests pluck wine glasses from their clever rigging and consider when to slip into alcove beds. Kitchenettes are at your disposal, but full-board means eating fresh salmon and moose meat in the 'Barta', a communal hut where everyone sits on reindeer skins around the fire – following a hot tub or sauna. Two cabins have private bathrooms and running water, but it's not a hardship to fill up your water bucket or share the bathroom and compost loos, especially when they, like everything, have been built by Sven himself, a master craftsman whose hand-made utopia this is. Go slow is his policy (why not canoe to the Sami Parliament instead of drive?) – except when he's winning the trans-Arctic sled race (for the 11th time). Which makes him, along with Viking-haired Christel, one of the best instructors in the art of dog 'mushing' across the frozen tundra, under the Northern Lights.
