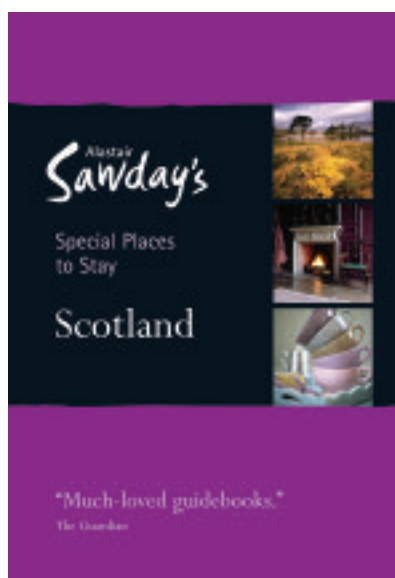




Scotland Edition 1
