Lower Brook House

The village is a Cotswold jewel, saved from the tourist hordes by roads too narrow for coaches. Lower Brook is no less alluring. It was built in 1624 to house workers from one of the 12 silk mills that made Blockley rich. Step inside to find country rugs on flagged floors, Farrow & Ball paints on timber framed walls, mullioned windows, vases of flowers and piles of vintage luggage. Winter logs smoulder in a huge inglenook in the sitting room – slide onto the leather sofa and roast away. Bedrooms are crisply stylish with beautiful fabrics, pristine linen, bowls of fresh fruit and handmade soaps in super little bathrooms. All but one overlooks the garden; views fly up the hill. Outside, colour bursts from the beds in summer and a small lawn runs down to a shaded terrace for afternoon tea in good weather. Walks start from the door: you can be deep in the country within half a mile. Come back to Anna's delicious cooking, perhaps mustard and cress soup, roast loin of lamb, rhubarb crumble; breakfast treats include smoothies, croissants and freshly squeezed juice. *Minimum stay two nights at weekends.*
